Commissioner's Woodley, Hawthorne, Blair, Durham and Judge Braddock were present, and the following member(s) absent (none), constituting a quorum of the Court present, at which time the following business, among other proceedings, was had:

County Judge, Mike Braddock, started the meeting with the pledge of allegiance to the United States and Texas flags, and County Commissioner, Matt Woodley, lead the invocation.

2. Public Comments pertaining to agenda items

County Judge gave the public an opportunity to discuss any related agenda items. No one from the public addressed the court.

3. Discuss and act upon Fire Contract Agreement with the City of O'Donnell and County of Lynn FY2024

Judge Braddock stated he had the Fire Contract with him and that it is the same as last years contract. He stated the contact is for \$3,000.00 which will go to the O'Donnell Fire Department. Jail Administrator, Rebeca McKibben gave the jail count, as follows, Total: 34 Lubbock: 17 Lynn: 17 Still housing a 1 for 1, meaning we are housing a Lubbock County Inmate for Lubbock County to house a Lynn County Inmate. Rebeca also stated she had to take an inmate to the hospital for seizures, he is now on his seizure medication, again, after he was taken off the medication by the Nurse Practitioner here.

They have not had any more issues with his seizures. Sheriff Wanda Mason, stated that on January 10, 2024, the Sheriff's Office will have a Truancy Officer, Deputy.

Commissioner Blair made the motion with Commissioner Durham seconding the motion to enter into Executive Session under 551.074 (personnel matters) at 9:36 a.m. All voted in favor, motion carried. Commissioner Durham made the motion with Commissioner Woodley seconding the motion to adjourn executive session and enter back into regular session at 10:20 a.m. All voted in favor, motion carried.
