Commissioner's Woodley, Hawthorne, Gass, Durham and Judge Braddock were present, and the following member(s) absent: (none), constituting a quorum of the Court present, at which time the following business, among other proceedings, was had:

County Commissioner Woodley started the meeting with the invocation and Judge Braddock led the pledge of allegiance to the United States and Texas flags.

#### **2. Public Comments pertaining to agenda items**

Judge Braddock gave the public an opportunity to discuss anything relating to agenda items. No one from the public addressed the court.

#### **3. Kathy Grant to give report on Lynn County Tax-Assessor Collector Office**

Kathy gave a report on her office from May 2024 to May 2025.

#### **4. Consider and act upon Budget Amendments**

There were no Budget Amendments to approve.

#### **5. Approve County Finance Reports**

Amy Schuknecht, County Treasurer, stated there was a Finance Report for the month of May 2025. Commissioner Woodley made the motion with Commissioner Gass seconding that motion to accept the Finance Report for the month of May. All voted in favor, motion carried.

## **6. Approve Bonds**

Karen Rendon, County Clerk, stated there were no bonds to approve.

## **7. Sheriff's Office to give report**

Martin Rosas, Jail Administrator, gave the jail count, as follows:

## **8. Discuss and act upon MOU between ICE and LCSO – Warrant Service Officer Program – mandated by 89<sup>th</sup> State Legislature (least of 3 options)**

Sheriff Mason stated in the MOU that ICE will have 48 hours to remove detainees after all charges are complete within Lynn County. Commissioner Durham made the motion with Commissioner Hawthorne seconding that motion to accept the MOU between ICE and LCSO. All voted in favor, motion carried.

## **9. Discuss and act upon SAVINS Grant (statewide automated victim notification service) Services Agreement using OAG's contractor. The agreement is between LCSO and SylogistGov, Inc.**

Sheriff Mason stated we have an agreement with SAVINS already but the OAG is going with a new vendor, and they will need an agreement signed with SylogistGov, Inc. Commissioner Hawthorne made the motion with Commissioner Woodley seconding that motion to accept the agreement between LCSO and SylogistGov, Inc. All voted in favor, motion carried.

## **10. Discuss and act upon LCSO donation to Tahoka ISD PD – LCSO unused equipment, decommissioned from 2018 Dodge pickup. Motorola in-car radio (05 model – year 2005 – 2020), control head for siren, 2 Visor/2 Rear red and blue lights, small side lights and cargo lights.**

Sheriff Mason stated Officer Edwards from Tahoka ISD got in touch with her about her old decommissioned equipment, for the new Tahoka ISD position. Sheriff asked if Lynn County would be willing to donate the unused equipment to Tahoka ISD. Commissioner Gass made the motion with Commissioner Durham seconding that motion to donate the unused and decommissioned equipment to Tahoka ISD PD. All voted in favor, motion carried.

**11. Discuss and act upon donation from Garza County to LCSO Jail Division – Dalby unit unused leg irons, handcuffs, large handcuffs, jail riot shields, and riot gear for 13 jailers.**

Jail Administrator Rosas stated the Sheriff from Garza County got in touch with him and asked if Lynn County Jail would be willing to receive the unused jail equipment from the Dalby Unit. JA Rosas stated the Lynn County Jail could use the extra equipment. Commissioner Woodley made the motion with Commissioner Gass seconding the motion to accept the unused equipment from the Dalby Unit. All voted in favor, motion carried.

**12. Approve and pay claims and payroll against the County**

Amy Schuknecht presented the bills. Commissioner Hawthorne made the motion with Commissioner Durham seconding that motion to approve the bills. All voted in favor, motion carried.

**13. Discuss any other items pertaining to County Business for information purposes only, no action may be taken on these items except to schedule them for future agenda.**

Judge Braddock stated the contractors doing the refinishing on all the doors, should be done this week. Judge Braddock also stated that the lights in the ground around the courthouse were fixed this past week, and the lights surrounding the square of the courthouse also were repaired.
