Commissioner's Woodley, Hawthorne, Blair, Durham and Judge Braddock were present, and the following member(s) absent: (none), constituting a quorum of the Court present, at which time the following business, among other proceedings, was had:

Judge Braddock started the meeting with the pledge of allegiance to the United States and Texas flags, and County Commissioner Matt Woodley, lead the invocation.

2. Public Comments pertaining to agenda items

Judge Braddock gave the public an opportunity to discuss anything relating to agenda items. Judge Filley spoke about his budget for the FY 2024-2025.

3. Consider and act upon Budget Amendments

County Treasurer, Amy Schuknecht, stated there were no budget amendments to approve.

Chief Deputy, Christopher Hennsely spoke about the remodel, as follows:

Jair flooring surface has started to peel away – 7400 sq ft of flooring that needs to be replaced. Inmate showers are tile right now, which has now started to peel away, which causes a safety hazard - do away with the tile showers – renovate 14 inmate showers to stainless steel shower inserts.

Also looking at adding a carport and a metal building garage system to the Sheriff's Office, for vehicle seizures for evidence or search. Christopher stated the Sheriff's Office has the money to pay for these renovations with the money made from inmate housing.

Commissioner Woodley made the motion with Commissioner Hawthorne seconding the motion to accept the remodel with a target budget of \$150,000. All voted in favor, motion carried.

18. Discuss and act upon setting Sheriff and Constable Fees

Sheriff Mason stated the fees will be staying the same. Commissioner Durham made the motion with Commissioner Blair seconding the motion. All voted in favor, motion carried.

19. Approve and pay claims and payroll against the County

County Treasurer, Amy Schuknecht, presented the bills to the court. Commissioner Blair made the motion and Commissioner Hawthorne seconded the motion to approve and pay claims and payroll against the county. All voted in favor, motion carried.

Amy Schuknecht, County Treasurer, stated budgets need to be turned in, ASAP. Judge Braddock mentioned that the Extension Office truck broke down in Comanche, and is working on trying to get it back.
